2022-23 SPEECH CONTEST RULES

GENERAL RULES:

- 1. Contestants must be high school students in grades 9, 10, 11, or 12.
- 2. Students being homeschooled or in a program recognized by their school district or the State of California are allowed to enter the speech contest.
- 3. A student may compete in only ONE Rotary District 5180 club speech contest.
- 4. Any prior year's winner at any level may compete again at the club level, as long as they are otherwise eligible, and advance to the next level if they win.
- 5. All contestants must ARRIVE or LOG IN at their designated contest locations NO LATER THAN TEN MINUTES PRIOR to the start of the contest. Late arrivals will be DISOUALIFIED.
- 6. **NEW POLICY:** Student contestants advancing to the Semi-Final Speech Contest level may only compete in the Area Semi-Final Speech Contest of his or her sponsoring Rotary Club.
- 7. The topic for every contest level is "Imagine Serving Up A Better Tomorrow."
- 8. The same speech must be used for all levels of competition.
- 9. No pictures or video recording are permitted during any speaker's presentation.
- 10. Under penalty of possible disqualification, contestants may not mention their name, school or sponsoring Rotary Club prior to or during their speech.
- 11. No displays, props or prompting are allowed. Clothing containing logos may be considered props.
- 12. Protests or concerns about the conduct of the contest at any level must be made to the moderator of the contest prior to the announcement of the winners.
- 13. All contestants must agree to speak at the Semi-Final and Final Speech contests should they advance that far.
- 14. In the event that a Club or Semi-Final winner becomes unable to compete at the next level, the runner-up in the original contest will be offered a chance to compete.
- 15. Enthusiastic, dignified, and polite audience applause is encouraged immediately following each contestant's presentation.
- 16. The speech must be at least 5 minutes, but not more than 8 minutes in length. A Timer Alert will be given to each contestant of Green at 5 minutes. Yellow at 7 minutes, and Red at 7 minutes and 30 seconds. Contestants with speeches ending before 5 minutes or after 8 minutes may be disqualified per recommendation of the Timekeeper and Speech Contest Moderator, but cannot place above fourth place.










General Information

- FAFSA Free Application for Federal Student Aid is the form to apply for financial aid for college. All families should complete this application no matter what their income by the March 2, 2023 deadline. This will be used to evaluate Cal Grants, Federal Aid such as Pell Grants, school aid, and some scholarships. It is also required to determine eligibility for the California College Promise Grant (formerly known as the BOG Fee Waiver). This permits enrollment fees to be waived. Yuba College requires completion of the FAFSA to qualify for the Yuba College Promise which will pay for tuition for new, first-time Yuba College students for up to two years. Apply online at https://studentaid.ed.gov
- 2. What is the Student Aid Report (SAR)?: The Student Aid Report (SAR) is a paper/electronic document that gives you some basic information about your eligibility for federal student aid and lists your answers to the questions on your FAFSA. If you provided a valid e-mail address on your FAFSA, you will receive an email with instructions on how to access an online copy of your SAR. If you did not (1) provide a valid email address on your FAFSA, (2) the social security number you included in your FAFSA did not match the one on file for you with the Social Security Administration, or (3) you did not sign your FAFSA, you will receive either a SAR or a SAR Acknowledgement via mail. Typically, you will be able to access your SAR within 2 weeks of filing your FAFSA. Note: Any student with an FSA ID can view or print their SAR by logging in to their account on the FAFSA homepage, then selecting view/print your SAR from the "My FAFSA" page. To determine what type of SAR you should receive and when you should receive it, visit: http://studentaid.ed.gov/fafsa/next-steps/student-aid-report#how-and-when

SCHOLARSHIPS (more scholarships can be found on goingmerry.com, studentscholarships.com and your naviance account)

1. Al Neuharth Free Spirit and Journalism Scholarship: The annual Al Neuharth Free Spirit and Journalism Conference program targets rising high school seniors who are interested in pursuing a career in journalism and who demonstrate qualities of "free spirit." Students are also awarded a \$1,000 college scholarship. This Freedom Forum Institute program was established in 1999 to honor Al Neuharth, the founder of USA Today, Newseum and the Freedom Forum. - 2. Be Bold Scholarship \$25,016: The "Be Bold" Scholarship is a no-essay scholarship that will be awarded to the applicant with the boldest profile. It takes less than 2 minutes to apply. To us, boldest does not mean "best", or "most accomplished". Being bold means being:
 - A) Earnest
 - B) Determined
 - C) Moving

The scholarship will be awarded to the student whose profile is most bold, according to these characteristics. 3. AMS Minority Scholarship: The American Meteorological Society (AMS) Minority Scholarships help support the college educations of minority students traditionally underrepresented in the sciences, especially Hispanic, Native American, and Black/African American students, who intend to pursue careers in the atmospheric or related oceanic and hydrologic sciences (marine biology does not meet this requirement). The two-year scholarships, funded through donations made by members to the AMS 100th Anniversary Campaign, are for \$3000 for a nine-month period in the freshman year and an additional \$3000 for a nine-month period in the sophomore year. https://app.goingmerry.com/scholarships/ams-minority-scholarships/5881

- 4. Mcdonalds HACER National Scholarship: In 1985, McDonalds created the McDonald's HACER Program to assist Hispanic students as they pursue their higher education goals. The McDonald's HACER National Scholarship is an outstanding opportunity for students who have at least one parent of Hispanic heritage. - Venus Morris Griffin Scholarship: It started with hardship. After overcoming a life of trials and tribulations, Venus Morris Griffin established a scholarship fund to help children much like her own. A \$10,000 annual scholarship fund was created to help deserving high school students with an incarcerated parent to ensure that nothing stops them from reaching their full potential. Since the inception of the scholarship fund, the goal grew to help more deserving individuals in need, and so the Venus Morris Griffin Foundation was born. https://vmgfoundation.org/

Deadline: February 15, 2023

7. Tri Counties Bank Scholarship Program: In partnership with the Community Foundation of the North State, Tri Counties Bank awards scholarships totaling \$110,000 to students attending community colleges, trade schools, and four year colleges/universities. Scholarships are awarded to high school seniors — especially, though not exclusively, to those who are economically disadvantaged — who demonstrate interest in public service, community engagement and business entrepreneurship. https://app.goingmerry.com/scholarships/tri-counties-bank-scholarship-program---merit-award/17459

8. Foot Locker Associate Scholarship: Each year, the Foot Locker Foundation awards one-year scholarships of \$5,000 to Foot Locker, Inc. associates who demonstrate unique personal passion at work, in the classroom, and in their communities. In addition, one winner will be selected to receive an additional \$5,000 award (for a total of \$10,000) for the Ken C. Hicks Scholarship award, in honor of our former chairman and CEO.
