Regular attendance is fundamental to your student's success in high school. Parental support is essential in the maintenance of accurate attendance records. We ask that you familiarize yourself with our procedures and review them with your students. If there are questions or verification needed on any of the Attendance Office policies, please do not hesitate to give us a call at the telephone numbers listed above.

LEAVE OF GROUNDS — PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

Students who need to leave school during the school day for any justifiable reason are required to check out through the Attendance Office. To receive a Leave of Grounds pass, a parent/guardian must do one of the following:

- 1) A parent/guardian is required to come to the Attendance Office & sign their student out of school. Please allow enough time for Attendance to retrieve your student from class.
- 2) Send a written note with your student. If it is a planned appointment, a note with the time and type of appointment, signed in ink by the parent/guardian with a telephone number for verification purposes will suffice. The student needs to pick up their Leave of Grounds pass before school or at break.
- 3) Send an email at least 60 minutes prior to the time of release or before 11:30 for a Lunch Pass. Email address must match the email address listed on the parent contact form. If the email does not match, the student will not be released. When sending an email, please type the student's first & last names in the subject line. Also state the time & reason they should be dismissed. *Reminder: the Attendance Office is continuously active with phone calls, students and parents in the office. Emails are checked as often as time allows.

If a student leaves campus without a Leave of Grounds pass, no matter what circumstances, it will be considered a CUT and they will face disciplinary action. Food delivery services like UberEats & DoorDash will not be accepted. Deliveries that arrive in the offices will be turned away.

CLEARING ABSENCES

All legitimate student absences must be cleared by a parent or guardian within 5 school days of the student's absence. These absences must be cleared in the following ways:

- 1) A note, signed in ink by a parent/guardian to the Attendance Office with the exact date, times and reason for the absence within 48 hours of the student's absence.
- 2) A telephone call from a parent/guardian to the Attendance Office indicating the exact time, date and reason for the absence.
- 3) An email to the Attendance Office with the parent name, student name, grade, date, time and reason for the absence.

EXCUSED ABSENCES

- 1) Illness (after 3 days of absence, a medical note is required)
- 2) Quarantine directed by a county or city health officer
- 3) Medical, dental and optometric appointments (please bring medical note to verify)
- 4) Attending funeral services for a member of the student's immediate family, so long as the absence is not more than one day if the service is local and not more than 3 days if the service is out of town.

PERSONAL JUSTIFIABLE ABSENCES

- 1) Court appearance
- 2) Attendance at a student's religious retreat not to exceed 4 hours per semester
- 3) Funeral service for someone other than an immediate family member
- 4) College visits

UNEXCUSED VERIFIED ABSENCES (Parents have called to verify but the reason is unexcused)

- 1) Vacation
- 2) DMV appointments or instructional driving lessons
- 3) Employment/Job interview or meetings

TARDY/LATE SLIPS

Students who are more than 10 minutes late to school should go directly to the Attendance Office for an admit to class.

Excused Tardy

1. Medical
2. Illness

Unexcused Tardy

1. Sleeping in
2. Transportation
3. Stopping for breakfast

There is an automated dialer that will call home when your student is marked absent one or more class periods during any school day. Please call the Attendance Office to verify these absences at 741-6180, ext. 3160 or 3108.

STUDENT WITHDRAWAL

If your student is checking out of school to attend elsewhere, please see your assigned counselor FIRST. Once a student has checked out with their counselor, they should go to the Attendance Office with their textbooks to receive a check-put form. This process should take no longer than 1 hour. If you are unable to come to school with your student, PLEASE send a note with them including the name of the school they be attending, a phone number to reach you and your signature in ink.

MESSAGES TO STUDENTS

Classes will not be disturbed or messages delivered to students during class hours. If a student is expecting a message, they need to listen for the all-call system or come by the Attendance Office and check for their message.

HOME & HOSPITAL

If a student is going to be out of school for a medical reason for an extended length of time, please contact their counselor for information on the Home & Hospital program.

18-YEAR-OLD CONTRACT

When a student turns 18, they are of legal age to clear their own absences. In order that they understand the responsibility of this, we require them to sign a contract with the Assistant Principal before we accept any excuses from them. Eligibility to obtain an 18-year old contract will be based upon 90% (or higher) attendance rate & a 2.0 (or higher) GPA. Upon completion, parents will need the student's consent to read their records. If students do not maintain a 90% attendance rate & a 2.0 GPA once the contract is signed, administration has the right to revoke it. It is the student's responsibility to maintain a 90% attendance rate.

SARB (STUDENT ATTENDANCE REVIEW BOARD)

When a student has excessive absences that have not been verified by a parent or guardian, a letter is sent home. The process is 3 letter: the 1st is informational; the 2nd requires a meeting with the Assistant Principal; the 3rd involves a hearing at the County Courthouse.

EXCESSIVE ABSENCES

District policy states that a student should be in attendance 90% of the school year. If a student misses more than 10%, parents will be required to get an excuse from their physician in order to excuse their student's absence. *Legal reference: Education Code 4601.*

General Information

1. **California State University Application:** Filing period for all CSU campuses is from **October 1 to November 30, 2022**. The preferred method of application is online at Cal State apply: <https://www2.calstate.edu/apply>
2. **University of California Application:** Filing period for all UC campuses is from **November 1 to November 30, 2022**. Students can start their application online beginning August 1, 2022 at www.universityofcalifornia.edu
3. **Common Application:** Many out of state and private colleges use the Common Application. The preferred method of application is online at www.commonapp.org
4. **Local Scholarships:** All local scholarship applications, along with state-wide/national scholarships, are located in the scholarship section of Naviance. Scholarships in Naviance are updated as new scholarships are received.

6. **College Board CSS/Financial Aid Profile:** Some colleges and universities (private) require the CSS Profile to be considered for financial and scholarship consideration. PROFILE online is at www.collegeboard.com Click on the PROFILE link under "Pay for college." Online application is preferred. There is comprehensive online help as well as the ability to chat online with a service representative.
7. **FAFSA:** The FAFSA is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Students submit the FAFSA to apply for financial aid for college from the federal government, state governments, and most colleges and universities. About 20 million students file the FAFSA each year. Financial aid includes grants, scholarships, student employment and student loans. The FAFSA Application opens **Friday, October 1, 2022**. For students to be considered for Cal Grants, they must complete and submit the FAFSA by **March 2, 2023**.

- 8.SAT Test Dates:** Deadline to register for the **November 5th test** is **October 7th** (late registration is available for a fee). Deadline for the **December 3rd test** is **November 3rd**. All test dates are listed on the MHS website in the College & Career Center tab under "Counseling" in the "Academics" tab. Contact Stan Easter in the College & Career Center for an application for a fee waiver if needed.
- 9.ACT Test Dates:** Deadline to register for the **December 10th test** is **November 4th** (late registration is available for a fee). All test dates are listed on the MHS website in the College & Career Center tab under "Counseling" in the "Academics" tab. Contact Stan Easter in the College & Career Center for an application for a fee waiver if needed.
- 10. What is the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)?:** The Educational Opportunity Program is designed to improve access and retention of historically low-income and educationally disadvantaged students. EOP students have the potential and demonstrated motivation to perform satisfactorily at a CSU and UC, but they have not been able to realize their potential because of their economic and educational background. The program provides admissions and academic assistance to EOP-eligible undergraduate students. In many cases, the program offers financial assistance to eligible students. Campuses tailor their programs to accommodate the needs of their student population. Each UC and CSU campus except California Maritime Academy has an EOP for low-income undergraduate students who are California residents and are disadvantaged because of their educational backgrounds. Students with a history of low income who need academic and financial assistance may apply for the program. EOP accepts students who do not meet regular admission criteria, as well as those who qualify for regular admission. Be sure to indicate on the application if you are applying through EOP.
- 11. What is Cal State Apply?:** Cal State Apply is an online resource designated to help students and their families learn about the CSU system, select a CSU campus to attend, plan to finance higher education, and apply for admission. Personal data entered by the user is not released without the user's express consent and direction. It is free to use. The student will only pay the application fee charged directly by the CSU campus when an application for admission is submitted. Check out:

The counseling department would like to make you aware of some important upcoming senior events. Additional information will be posted in the senior counseling google classroom under the topic, "*Financial Aid*" and "*4 year University Applications*." We encourage students and parents/guardians to join!

Financial Aid Applications

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (**FAFSA**) and the California Dream Act Application (**CADAA**) are used to evaluate Cal Grants, Federal Aid such as Pell Grants, school aid, and some scholarships.

Each student will only apply to 1 application. All seniors will complete the **FAFSA** application unless they are an undocumented dream act eligible students in which they would fill out the **CADAA** Application.

Both financial aid applications open Saturday, October 1, 2022 and have a priority deadline of March 2, 2023.

Apply online at <https://studentaid.gov> to complete the 2023-2024 (FAFSA) or visit <https://dream.csac.ca.gov/landing> to complete the 2023-2024 (CADAA) Application.

AB 469 FAFSA/CADAA Completion Requirement:

This year the State of California passed **Assembly Bill 469**, requiring all school districts to ensure that a grade 12 student who has *not opted out*, completes and submits either the (**FAFSA**) or the (**CADAA**) before the end of the school year. Please keep in mind that the priority deadline still remains as March 2, 2023. If a student fails to submit by the priority deadline, it can greatly impact their financial aid award package.

In efforts to assist **ALL SENIORS**, Marysville High School Counselors will be partnering with Yuba College staff to offer financial aid application assistance during seniors scheduled Civics or Economics class time. After school, in the Library, from 3:15 PM - 5:30 PM on **Tuesday, November 1, 2022**, Yuba College and MHS Counseling will be available for parents and students in order to assist with finalization and submission of

the financial aid applications. Please **create a Parent FSA ID** before this date and plan to attend.

What Should Students Bring/Complete For November 1, 2022?

1. Create a personal email separate from their MJUSD student email address to use for college planning. MJUSD student email will not be accessible after graduation.
2. Student's Social Security Number
3. Parents Income Taxes from Year 2021
4. Have Completed an FSA ID for students to sign into their online financial aid application. A posting has been made in the Counseling Google Classroom, under the topic, "Financial Aid" *Please complete your student FSA ID at least 24 hrs prior to November 1, 2022.*

Additional Information:

- The Yuba College Promise Grant (2 years FREE) opportunity for students does require that they have their FAFSA or CADAA completed, remember the Promise is **not** based on income. *(This permits enrollment fees to be waived for up to two years for new, first-time Yuba College students).*
- All families should complete this application no matter what their income by the **March 2, 2023 deadline.**
- Parents or Guardians will also need to create an FSA ID to electronically submit their FAFSA or CADAA Application.

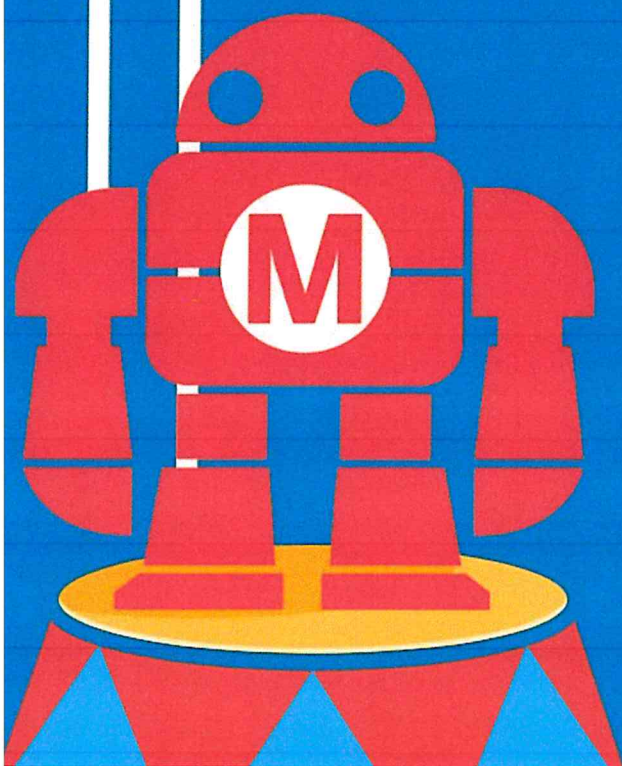
