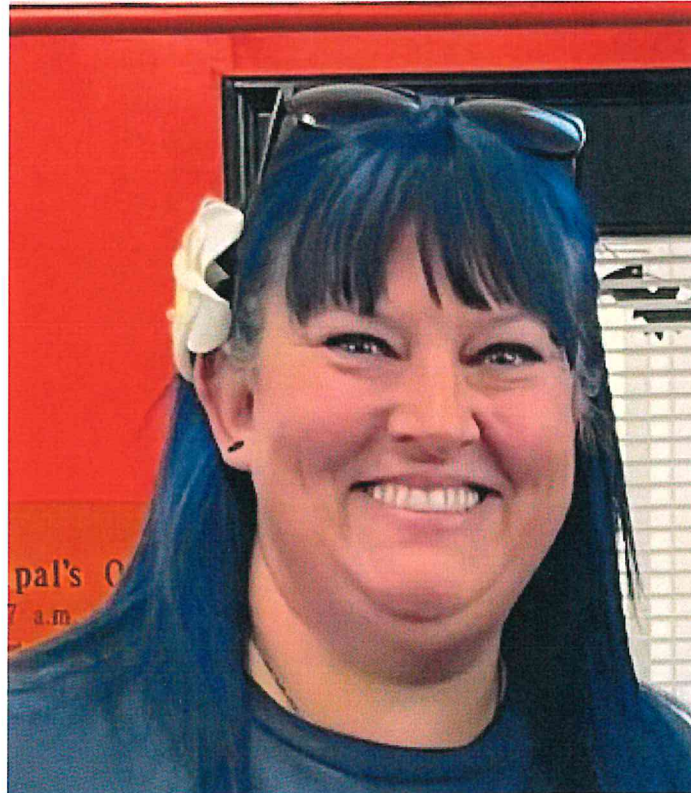

Pedestrian Safety Reminders

Follow the rules of the road and obey all traffic signs & signals.

Walk on sidewalks whenever they are available.

If there is no sidewalk available, walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible.



Cross streets at crosswalks or intersections. Look for cars in all directions, including cars turning right or left.

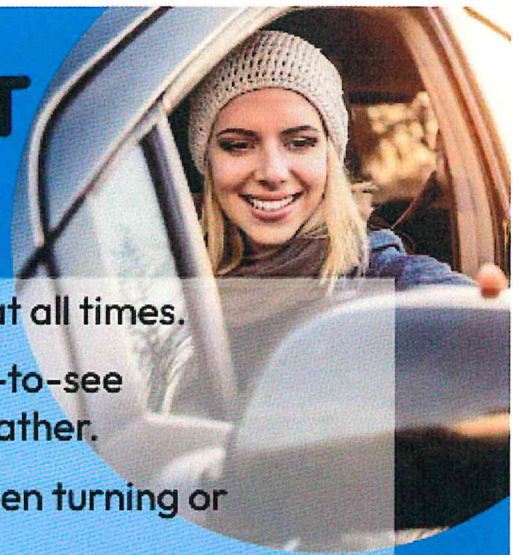
Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways, or backing up in parking lots.

Aproximatly 250 deaths every year are pedestrians attempting to cross a busy road.
Don't risk it!



If a crosswalk or intersection is not available, locate a well-lit area where you have the best view of traffic. Wait for a gap in traffic that allows enough time to cross safely. Continue watching for traffic as you cross. Cross quickly.

DRIVER & PARKING LOT SAFETY REMINDERS



1. Look out for pedestrians everywhere, at all times.
2. Use extra caution when driving in hard-to-see conditions such as nighttime or bad weather.
3. Slow down and be prepared to stop when turning or otherwise entering a crosswalk.
4. Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and stop well behind the crosswalk to give other vehicles an opportunity to see the crossing pedestrians so they can stop too.
5. Never pass vehicles stopped at a crosswalk. There may be people crossing that you don't see.
6. Never drive under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
7. Follow all speed limits, especially around people on the street, in school zones, and in neighborhoods.
8. Be extra cautious when backing up and look for pedestrians.
9. Do not text and drive. Keep all technology off and away to avoid distracted driving.
10. Make sure you can see clearly through your windshield, windows and mirrors.
11. Stay in lanes & avoid cutting across parking lots.
12. Drive slowly & use directional signals.
13. Be alert & anticipate the actions of other drivers.
14. Obey stop signs & no-parking signs.
15. When backing out of a space, be mindful of vehicles & pedestrians.



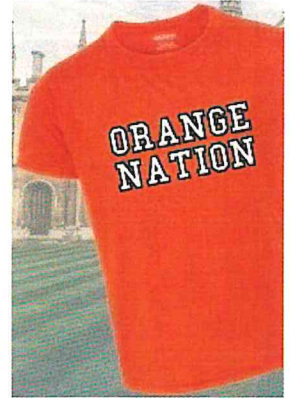

Yuba College has released information about the upcoming spring 2023 Dual Enrollment Program. As many of you are aware, high school students may be eligible to take college courses while in high school for **FREE!**

Where to start:

Have your son/daughter make an appointment with their high school counselor to determine eligibility and to help guide them through the enrollment process.

Steps To Apply:

1. See their high school counselor.
2. Students' interested in taking college courses next spring semester will need to submit an online application for admission to Yuba College (*the application is now open*).
3. Complete/submit a High School Recommendation Form. The 1st day to submit the form for pre-approval is Monday, November 7, 2022.
4. A completed High School Recommendation Form can be emailed to YCadmissions@yccd.edu through a yuba college student email or sent directly by their high counselor per student request.

Spring 2023 Yuba College Courses:

The spring 2023 schedule of classes is available for viewing online at <https://yc.yccd.edu/admissions/courses>. Type the course you are looking for in the search bar to see requirements, dates offered, etc.

Senior MHS Parents/Guardians and Students,

The counseling department would like to make you aware of some important information regarding the financial aid application process. Additional information will be posted in the senior counseling google classroom under the topic, "*Financial Aid*". We encourage students and parents/guardians to join!

Financial Aid Applications

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (**FAFSA**) and the California Dream Act Application (**CADAA**) are used to evaluate Cal Grants, Federal Aid such as Pell Grants, school aid, and some scholarships.

Each student will only apply to 1 application. All seniors will complete the **FAFSA** application unless they are an undocumented dream act eligible students in which they would fill out the **CADAA** Application.

Both financial aid applications opened Saturday, October 1, 2022 and have a priority deadline of March 2, 2023.

Apply online at <https://studentaid.gov> to complete the 2023-2024 (FAFSA) or visit <https://dream.csac.ca.gov/landing> to complete the 2023-2024 (CADAA) Application.

AB 469 FAFSA/CADAA Completion Requirement:

This year the State of California passed **Assembly Bill 469**, requiring all school districts to ensure that a grade 12 student who has *not opted out*, completes and submits either the (**FAFSA**) or the (**CADAA**) before the end of the school year. Please keep in mind that the priority deadline still remains as March 2, 2023. If a student fails to submit by the priority deadline, it can greatly impact their financial aid award package.

In efforts to assist **ALL SENIORS**, Marysville High School Counselors partnered with Yuba College staff to offer financial aid application assistance during seniors scheduled Civics or Economics class time on **Tuesday, November 1, 2022**.

We are encouraging all seniors to complete their financial aid applications by **Tuesday, January 31st** and submit proof of completion, by uploading a picture of their confirmation email to their Civics/Economics google classroom to be included in a FREE opportunity drawing.

Additional Information:

- Keep a look out for additional on campus support in collaboration with Yuba College staff for financial application assistance for your student.
- The Yuba College Promise Grant (2 years FREE) opportunity for students does require that they have their FAFSA or CADAA completed, remember the Promise is **not** based on income. *(This permits enrollment fees to be waived for up to two years for new, first-time Yuba College students).*
- Parents or Guardians will also need to create an FSA ID to electronically submit their FAFSA or CADAA Application.

November 2022

General Information

1. **California State University Application:** Filing period for all CSU campuses is from **October 1 to November 30, 2022**. The preferred method of application is online at Cal State apply: <https://www2.calstate.edu/apply>
2. **University of California Application:** Filing period for all UC campuses is from **November 1 to November 30, 2022**. Students can start their application online beginning August 1, 2020 at www.universityofcalifornia.edu
3. **Common Application:** Many out of state and private colleges use the Common Application. The preferred method of application is online at www.commonapp.org
4. **Local Scholarships:** All local scholarship applications, along with state-wide/national scholarships, are located in the scholarship section of Naviance. Scholarships in Naviance are updated as new scholarships are received.

6. **College Board CSS/Financial Aid Profile:** Some colleges and universities (private) require the CSS Profile to be considered for financial and scholarship consideration. PROFILE online is at www.collegeboard.com Click on the PROFILE link under "Pay for college." Online application is preferred. There is comprehensive online help as well as the ability to chat online with a service representative.
7. **FAFSA:** The FAFSA is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Students submit the FAFSA to apply for financial aid for college from the federal government, state governments, and most colleges and universities. About 20 million students file the FAFSA each year. Financial aid includes grants, scholarships, student employment and student loans. The FAFSA Application opens **October 1, 2022**. For students to be considered for Cal Grants, they must complete and submit the FAFSA by **March 2, 2022**.

8. **What is the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)?:** The Educational Opportunity Program is designed to improve access and retention of historically low-income and educationally disadvantaged students. EOP students have the potential and demonstrated motivation to perform satisfactorily at a CSU and UC, but they have not been able to realize their potential because of their economic and educational background. The program provides admissions and academic assistance to EOP-eligible undergraduate students. In many cases, the program offers financial assistance to eligible students. Campuses tailor their programs to accommodate the needs of their student population.
Each UC and CSU campus except California Maritime Academy has an EOP for low-income undergraduate students who are California residents and are disadvantaged because of their educational backgrounds. Students with a history of low income who need academic and financial assistance may apply for the program. EOP accepts students who do not meet regular admission criteria, as well as those who qualify for regular admission. Be sure to indicate on the application if you are applying through EOP.
9. **What is Cal State Apply?:** Cal State Apply is an online resource designated to help students and their families learn about the CSU system, select a CSU campus to attend, plan to finance higher education, and apply for admission. Personal data entered by the user is not released without the user's express consent and direction. It is free to use. The student will only pay the application fee charged directly by the CSU campus when an application for admission is submitted. Check out:
