

September 2024

General Information

- California State University Application: Filing period for all CSU campuses is from October 1 to November 30, 2024. The preferred method of application is online at Cal State apply: https://www2.calstate.edu/apply
- 2. **University of California Application:** Filing period for all UC campuses is from **October 1 to December 2, 2024.** Students can start their application online beginning August 1, 2023 at www.universityofcalifornia.edu
- 3. **Common Application:** Many out of state and private colleges use the Common Application. The preferred method of application is online at www.commonapp.org
- 4. **Local Scholarships:** All local scholarship applications, along with state-wide/national scholarships, are located on the google scholarship page. The class code to join the google classroom is <code>nxyqky4</code>.

- 6. **College Board CSS/Financial Aid Profile:** Some colleges and universities (private) require the CSS Profile to be considered for financial and scholarship consideration. PROFILE online is at www.collegeboard.com Click on the PROFILE link under "Pay for college." Online application is preferred. There is comprehensive online help as well as the ability to chat online with a service representative.
- 7. **FAFSA:** The FAFSA is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Students submit the FAFSA to apply for financial aid for college from the federal government, state governments, and most colleges and universities. About 20 million students file the FAFSA each year. Financial aid includes grants, scholarships, student employment and student loans. FAFSA will be open on Oct 1, 2024, the priority deadline will be March 3, 2025.
- 8. What is the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)?: The Educational Opportunity Program is designed to improve access and retention of historically low-income and educationally disadvantaged students. EOP students have the potential and demonstrated motivation to perform satisfactorily at a CSU and UC, but they have not been able to realize their potential because of their economic and educational background. The

program provides admissions and academic assistance to EOP-eligible undergraduate students. In many cases, the program offers financial assistance to eligible students. Campuses tailor their programs to accommodate the needs of their student population. Each UC and CSU campus except California Maritime Academy has an EOP for low-income undergraduate students who are California residents and are disadvantaged because of their educational backgrounds. Students with a history of low income who need academic and financial assistance may apply for the program. EOP accepts students who do not meet regular admission criteria, as well as those who qualify for regular admission. Be sure to indicate on the application if you are applying through EOP.

- 9. What is Cal State Apply?: Cal State Apply is an online resource designated to help students and their families learn about the CSU system, select a CSU campus to attend, plan to finance higher education, and apply for admission. Personal data entered by the user is not released without the user's express consent and direction. It is free to use. The student will only pay the application fee charged directly by the CSU campus when an application for admission is submitted. Check out: http://www2.calstate.edu
